Science

- Learn how a bit works by understanding pressure points and leverage works
- Learn how a horse's confirmation will dictate their movement and discipline
- Learn how a horse digests its food mechanically and chemically

Here are other opportunities to explore Horses:

- Attend a horse show, rodeo, or other horse event
- Visit a horse farm, horse training facility, horse boarding facility, etc.
- Participate in a horse riding camp
- Visit a local tack shop or horse supply store
- Check out horse events on television to learn about different type of horse shows and events
- Create a collection of horse showmanship and horsemanship patterns
- Keep a diary of your practices each week
- Research horse-related careers
- Give a public speech or team demonstration or compete with a painting, poster, photograph, drawing, essay, poetry, scrapbook, digital story, clothes article, woodworking piece or a model horse
- Participate in a community service project, bringing ideas back to your community.
- Is it fair time? Consider riding in your County Fair horse show or the Florida State Fair.

Project Sharing Ideas

- Make a diagram of horse coloring/marking patterns, horse body parts, the horse life cycle, or a horse skeleton
- Develop a horse health or supplies price chart
- Make a scrapbook of the history of horses
- Horse body language
- Design a floorplan for a horse stable
- Make a YouTube video of how to groom a horse, tag a horse, proper safety around horses, and how to show a horse
- Identify dental problems of horses
- Create a horse first-aid kit
