Tuesday	Aug 1	2:15- 5:15PM	State Council Meeting— Impromptu Speeches & Officer Elections  During the impromptu speeches, the outgoing officers will ask a question to each candidate seeking their office.  Each candidate will respond to the question.  Candidates running for President will have two minutes and all other offices will have one and a half minutes to answer the question.  Voting will take place through an online form utilizing preferential voting.  Preferential voting has all voters rank each position's candidates in descending order of who they'd prefer.  During round 1:  Ballots are organized by who received the 1st ranking for a position.  If a majority is reached by this, then winning candidates are confirmed.  If a majority is not reached, then round 2 takes place.  During round 2  The candidate with the lowest number of 1st rankings is taken away.  The ballots with the removed candidate are then counted towards the candidate based of the 2 <sup>nd</sup> ranking.  If a majority is reached, then winning candidates are confirmed.  If a majority is not reached, then rounds continue to take place.  Rounds will continue until a majority is reached.  Each subsequent round will consist of removing the candidate with the lowest number of votes and distributing their ballots based off the next highest ranking.
