Communication:

- Through being the chair of iLEAD, I have developed my ability to communicate effectively through written communications to ensure everyone stays on top of their tasks. I also have learned the importance of digital communication as I had to learn more about proper emailing and effective emailing to send proactive emails when we were not in person at executive board
- As president of my county council, I learned not only how to communicate my ideas with others, but also how to facilitate communication between other youth.
- During my time on the South East District Board, I learned how to facilitate clear communication between members over zoom, which has made me well rounded with communicating not only in person, but also through a screen.

Self responsibility:

- As president, I have learned that if I don't stay accountable for my responsibilties, they don't get done. I have

- During the Florida 4-H Food Challenge, I worked to foster effective teamwork between my fellow team

Planning/Organizing:

- As part of the Florida 4-H Legislature Committee last year, I had to learn how to organize and plan good
 committee meetings to ensure youth involvement. It was very scary for me, but I quickly learned I would be
 okay with support from my fellow committee members.
- On county council this year, we planned an After Fair Party for all of our county youth to enjoy to celebrate
 their fair accomplishments. This took a lot of careful planning and processing to do, especially to make sure
 we had input from the entire group. It was overall, a major improvement from last year's event, and was
 executed much better.
- This year as the youth chair of iLEAD, I had to learn how to manage a large scale event, something much bigger than I had ever done before. I was frightened at first, but quickly learned how to manage different aspects of the event that needed to get taken care of, and now I am looking forward to a great event in June!
