

Record Keeping - Activity Option 3

Record keeping helps you keep track of your expenses, your rabbit's health and development, and other aspects of your project. Records are only of use if you keep consistent and accurate records. In this activity you will practice keeping consistent records which will help you become more familiar with your rabbit's environment.

Monitor the area where you will keep your rabbit. Take these measurements for at least a week, but the longer the better! Take measurements in the different locations in which you will keep your rabbit. Try to consistently measure at least one week during each season; winter, spring, summer and fall. This will give you a better idea of the environmental changes that your rabbit will be exposed to. Take measurements at sunrise, mid-afternoon, and sunset each day.
